JUNE VISIT TO JERSEY

I will start with the first visit from Bad Wuzach in June , it was the first time the new Mayor Frau Sherer had come to the Island, there were an number of official events on the first full day, Lola and her team organised a number of less formal events, these included a guided Oyster walk to Seymour Tower with Trudie (who could speak fluent German which helped great to explain the many things found during the event), followed by a diner at the Seymour Inn. The next day and early start for a days event travelling ground the island with local historian guide Mark Yates, with a stop at the Poplars Tea Room, for lunch, I think we all learned a great deal more about our island during this event. In the evening we had a Farewell buffet at the Belvedere Restaurant. On the whole a great few days.

APRIL LIBERATION CELEBRATIONS

In April we held our annual liberation celebrations at the war tunnels, three readings by the Jersey Arts Centre youth theatre followed by an extract of Michael Shepard's *Memories of April 1945 Liberation* in Wurzach was read by Lola, the service, and prayers for carried out by Father Nick and the Remembrance and one minute's silence by Clive, this was followed by the laying of roses at the garden of remembrance. We then adjourned for afternoon tea in the Café, the event was well attended 54 guests including 9 former internees.

MAY KINGS CORONATION AND LIBERATION CELEBRATIONS

In late February we were informed that there would be an official visit to Jersey of a delegation from Bad Wurzach and other twinning delegations, for the weekend of the Kings Coronation and 78th Liberation celebrations, despite having a ridiculously short time to organise this Lola and her team worked tirelessly to get a special full programme in place to work in conjunction with the official programme, for Lola these became a full-time job as all the way up to the weekend and even during the events themselves there was constant change and amendments to the programme by third parties, the Partnerschaft have to be extremely grateful to Lola for the effort she put in to make this a success, also to those committee members who assisted with this and taking time out to transport the guests to various events.
